RIC & Referee Allocator report

The past month has been spent going out and observing as many of the officials that were new last year. Since the balancing games and now that the league's placement games have begun I have spent quite a bit of time at the rink. I have spoken to quite a few of them and although there are still a number of them I still have to see we have a good baseline to work with and will hopefully be getting a number of them moved up with their gradings, so they can participate in more games.

We have only had a handful of officials stepping up to do games which does make it difficult to evaluate all the officials but the ones that are eager will be moving up.

The Clinic for the New referees was held on Saturday. We originally had communication with 13 New Westminster individuals that were interested. We then started receiving requests from other associations because they had either missed their associations clinic or they didn't have one to go to. That being said we opened it up to Hollyburn, West Van., and Richmond. This would have brought our numbers up to approximately 25 participants. By the end of the back and forth with everyone we ended up with 10 participating. 9 individuals from our association and 1 from Richmond. The ones from other associations ended up finding a clinic closer or their association ended up getting one provided for them. The small group was a good dynamic for the instructor and the RIC.

Atom A1 team second round selections went well. Two goalies, 14 skaters, 6 taxi squad began practice October 13.

Two Atom C teams: Each team has two goalies and 15 skaters. We had three balancing games and coaches were settled with the squads at the end of game three. At the leagu level, Atom C1 is in the Blue Group and Atom C2 is in the Gold Group. There was a coach/manager for each C team at the PCAHA meeting, NWMHA coach meeting, and NWMHA Managers meeting. Atom C2 players and team officials attended the Canucks vs Flames game on Saturday October 14th.

Mann cup was a challenge, but we deal with it as best we could and got our work done. My thanks to Lynda for her over the top efforts in getting us as much ice as she could. Great work in very challenging conditions. Thanks to Jeff and Rob for their help in the tryout process and for filling in for me while I was away.

TRYOUTS:

40+skaters 4 goalies

Process went fairly smooth, some challenges arranging coaches for tryouts, but that's par for the course.

Divided the players into 3 groups for skill assessment each player was given one skill session, at the end of the skill session we released three to four players and then played two tryout games. After the games, in consultation with RPM and Viet, it was decided we had enough talent, depth and goaltending to have an A2 team. Once that was decided, we needed to find a coach. There was some confusion in the communication between our newly arrived coach from Chilliwack, Larry Ling, and myself but in the end Larry was keen to have an A2 team and we are glad he has taken it on with passion.

At this point we released down to 20+ A1 players, with the remaining players being assigned to the A2 tryout process. After a week or so of games A1 coach Shawn Hagan released 3 players to the A2 with 2 more released the following week setting his team for the season. A2 coach Larry Ling worked efficiently to get games going with the players he had and after a couple weeks he was able to release the players needed and set his team. Both teams are playing placement games and setting up for the season.

C team process:

3 teams of 17 skaters and one goalie – Pending two transfers.

The Mann cup pushed everything back, providing some challenges in getting coaches out to the warm up skates in early Sept. Thankfully, Brad Semkew, and Larry Ling stepped up every time and Coach James Musgrave was a big help as well. One of the challenges I had this fall was a heavy travel schedule that basically saw me out of town for 4 out of 6 weeks. I was able to maintain some communication and direct players and coaches through the process, but it was difficult...We did our draft including all rep releases on Sept. 25th and began playing in-house balancing games Sunday Oct 1st.

The in-house games have been pretty even, one team is clearly stronger, but the coaches feel comfortable with the teams. Coaches agree to make a couple changes for balancing and we're now pretty confident that the teams are balanced. Goaltending is an issue in C, we aren't particularly strong at that position, but again one goalie is stronger than the other two, and it makes it hard to balance.

One goalie had some difficulty with the rep evaluations and missed his time....didn't matter as Viet was at the games and the goalie ended up in the right spot.

One family was unhappy about a balancing move; however they did agree and will make the best of it.

Teams are looking at tournaments, A2 has one in November in Revelstoke, all teams ae aware of their commitment to the Herb House tournament.
